The gospel for Easter's seventh Sunday is always taken from the long prayer Jesus prays for his followers in John's gospel on the night before his death, and always includes Jesus' desire that his followers will be one as he and the Father are one. This oneness is not mere doctrinal agreement or institutional unity, but mutual abiding, interpenetrating life, mutual love, and joy. This oneness is the work of the Spirit whom we have received but also await. Come, Holy Spirit!

WELCOME TO WORSHIP AT CHRIST THE KING CHURCH!

Face Coverings: You are welcome to wear face coverings, but you may also notice that some are no longer choosing face coverings. Please take that into consideration as to how you participate in worship. Remember that we come to worship from different levels of potential exposure to illness.

AudioFetch: For those who need additional help hearing the service use AudioFetch. To use the system, download the AudioFetch app through the GooglePlay store or the Apple App store on any smart phone or tablet. Join the CTK Wifi with the password heisrisen325! You can send the sound signal directly to any Bluetooth device (like many hearing aids) or through any other system your device can connect with.

Holy Communion: Communion may be received while remaining at your seat with the pre-filled communion cups. Collect a cup off a tray on the usher's table at the beginning of worship. Prefilled grape juice with wafer and wine with wafer are available. Please request gluten free/ grape juice

prefilled from Pastor Connie or Richard Tiegs, as we store this in a different area so as not to confuse or get mixed up with the other options.

Communion may be received by circling around the altar. Follow the usher's directions. Pastor Connie will distribute the bread and gluten free wafers. If you desire gluten free wafer indicate by placing your hand palm down and then turn your palm to receive the wafer.

The communion assistant will offer the tray of individual cups. Please select the nearest cup. Grape juice is in the center ring of the tray. An acolyte will collect your empty cup.

Communion will be in one direction, always beginning in the back of the most south section (piano/organ side) and returning to your seat through the north aisle. An usher will indicate when to move forward for communion.

You may request communion to be brought to you by asking the pastor.

Offering: We will pass the offering plate but if you prefer you may place your offering in the wooden plate on the Ushers table. See the back of the bulletin or our web page for electronic giving options.

WORD

God Speaks to us in a scripture reading, preaching, and song.

In the days between Jesus' ascension and Pentecost, Peter oversees the process whereby one of the members of the community of believers is chosen to be the twelfth apostle, in order to fill the vacancy created by Judas's treachery and death.

FIRST READING: Acts 1:15-17, 21-26

¹⁵In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred twenty persons) and said, ¹⁶"Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus—17 for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry." ²¹So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, ²²beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection." ²³So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. ²⁴Then they prayed and said, "Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen ²⁵to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." ²⁶And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

The word of the Lord. Thanks be to God

To respond to the first reading, we read the instructional Psalm 1. Judas is like the chaff, while we join with Matthias to be like the fruitful trees. The frontispiece of the Psalms section in Evangelical Lutheran Worship (p. 339) depicts the church in praise as this fruitful tree. Christians see themselves as nourished by the pool of baptism, the "streams of water" of which the psalmist speaks.

PSALM: Psalm 1 (Read responsively between Lector and congregation)

Happy are they who have not walked in the counsel of the wicked, nor lingered in the way of sinners, nor sat in the seats of the scornful!

²Their delight is in the law of the LORD,

and they meditate on God's teaching day and night.

³They are like trees planted by streams of water, bearing fruit in due season, with leaves that ¹ do not wither:

everything they do shall prosper.

⁴It is not so with the wicked;

they are like chaff which the wind | blows away.

⁵Therefore the wicked shall not stand upright when judgment comes, nor the sinner in the council of the righteous.

⁶For the Lord knows the way | of the righteous, but the way of the wicked shall | be destroyed.

God has borne witness to the gift of eternal life in Jesus Christ. Whoever believes in the Son of God believes in the witness of God and has the promise of eternal life.

SECOND READING: 1 John 5:9-13

⁹If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son. ¹⁰Those who believe in the Son of God have the testimony in their hearts. Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son. ¹¹And this is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. ¹²Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.

¹³I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.



GOSPEL: John 17:6-19

[Jesus prayed:] 6"I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. ⁷Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; 8 for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. ⁹I am asking on their behalf: I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. ¹⁰All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. ¹¹And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one.

¹²While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. ¹³But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. ¹⁴I have given them your word. and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. ¹⁵I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. ¹⁶They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. ¹⁷Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. 19 And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth."

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NICENE CREED

We confess our faith with the whole church.

MEAL


God feeds us with the presence of Jesus Christ.

A collection of material goods for the church's mission, including the care of those in need, is a sign of the giving our whole selves in grateful response for all God's gifts. The table is set with bread and wine.




INVITATION TO COMMUNION


Those who choose to commune by prefilled cups will commune first together. While Lamb of God is sung, servers will prepare for distribution. When servers are in position come forward for communion.

UNITED IN CHRIST

The concept of the Trinity, one God, three in one, one in three, can be a little hard, sometimes, to get ahold of. But perhaps what scripture's witness to the Trinity boils down to is this: Jesus is in constant communication, continual, active relationship with the Father. The Father is in constant communication, continual, active relationship with the Son. And the Spirit is in and with and between both, always its own presence, but always, nonetheless, one in active relationship, one in ceaseless communication, with both the Father and the Son. Jesus prays that we may be "one" in the same fashion.

Conflict happens in the body of Christ all the time. Sometimes it is over matters of great significance: how we read scripture, how we are to conduct our lives, how the church is to think and act as it comes head-to-head with the constant pull and tug of the culture within and around it. Sometimes the conflict is personal. We resist the neighbor, and worse, out of hurt, anger, and anxiety. Sometimes the conflict can seem to be over a matter of pure nonsense: which way pickles should be sliced, and why they should be sliced that way.

Where and how, then, is our hope of being "one," as our Lord has so prayed? It is in this: whatever our conflict, we belong to one another. Whatever our conflict, we are called to work at staying in active relationship, honest communication. We are not one, finally, when the issues between us wane, or cease. We are one because the Lord of life holds us together in the promise of his love even when powerful forces, at one and the same time, pull us apart. We are one because the body and blood of Christ have been given to each of us, and all of us.

COMMEMORATIONS

Matthias, Apostle Tuesday, May 14, 2024

Matthias was the apostle added to the Twelve after Jesus' resurrection, as a replacement for the dead Judas Iscariot. He had traveled among the followers of Jesus throughout the Lord's ministry. Formerly commemorated on February 24, Matthias's celebration is moved to May 14 in agreement with most Western calendars.

Erik, King of Sweden, martyr, died 1160 Saturday, May 18, 2024

Erik is considered the patron saint of Sweden. As king of that nation, he tried to bring peace in the region, and to spread Christianity in Scandinavia. He was also known for his attempts to make fair laws and to protect those who were poor or sick.
